



City of Cape Coral Caloosahatchee Connect Project Notice of Right-of-Way Clearing

Construction on Everest Parkway expected to begin March 21, 2022. You are receiving this notice because you may have items in the City's right-of-way (ROW) that will be impacted by construction. Contractors for the City of Cape Coral will install a pipeline underneath the Caloosahatchee River to Horton Park and then continue along the north side of Everest Parkway to connect to the City of Cape Coral's Everest Water Reclamation Facility. **Contractors will begin clearing the right-of-way along the north side of Everest Parkway on March 21, 2022.** The team will mark trees and landscaping that require removal from the ROW.

All marked personal property items in the ROW must be removed no later than March 21, 2022. If personal property items are not removed, they may be removed by the contractor.

Demolition will include removal of some asphalt roadway, personal property items, and driveway aprons within the right of way generally on the north side of Everest Parkway. United States Postal Service approved mailboxes may be temporarily removed/relocated during construction but will be reinstalled as construction progresses except for decorative/monument style mailboxes. Decorative/monument style mailboxes will not be replaced and must be removed by the homeowner. Disturbed driveway aprons will be replaced, and disturbed lawns will be resodded.
